Dear Ron

I, Dr Andrew Denman of the Orange Veterinary Hospital examined 30 Wagyu heifers for Mr Ron Webster at his property situated at 1097 Daveys Plains Rd, Cudal, NSW 2864 on Thursday the 29th of August 2019. The examination involved close observation of the heifers in a small enclosed yard and then observing them from a distance in a larger holding area. The heifers were all in good body condition, and were all bright and alert and reactive during the examination. No obvious signs of respiratory illness (nasal discharge/coughing) or gastrointestinal illness (wastage/chronic scour) was noted. During the exam there were no signs of lameness (acute or chronic) noted and feet confirmation was good. There were no obvious signs of pink eye infection or scarring during the examination.

Some hair loss was noted during the exam which in my opinion at this time of the year would be related to a mild lice infestation. This level of infestation is normal for this age of cattle at this time of year in our district.

In my professional opinion these animals were in good general health with no signs of acute or chronic health problems
