Sale Day Safety

- Electric fences are on
- Visitors enter pens at own risk, if you do not want to enter pens please ask and we will bring bulls to the fence
- All bulls have been assessed for temperament
- No children allowed in pens
- Be aware of fighting bulls
- We do not expect bulls to be aggressive with humans, but sale day places extraordinary pressure on them as they are experiencing a completely foreign environment
- Do not crowd bulls or loiter in the pens
- Do not enter pens unnecessarily
- Report any undesirable bull behaviour to a Hicks Beef staff member

Taking delivery of your new Bull

To help your new bull or bulls to settle into their new home as well as possible, the following points should be followed.

- All Hicks Beef bulls are run in large mobs their entire lives, so they've always had plenty of mates around, and they have never been alone.
- It's a good idea to have some cattle in the yard when the bull arrives to ensure that he has company.
- At Hicks beef we handle our cattle quietly and confidently. We use motorbikes
 and utes, with the aid of obedient dogs. The bulls have <u>not</u> been handled with
 horses.
- Handle your new bull/s quietly and with respect and he'll settle into his new home well, and will be easy to handle whenever the need arises.
- All sale bulls to be delivered to their new home within 7 days please.
