Hypotrichosis (HY)

HYC denotes animals that have one copy of the HY gene. HY has been reported in the Hereford breed for many years and is non-lethal. Hypotrichosis can only occur when two carrier animals are mated together. Even in that instance there is only a twenty five percent chance that the progeny will inherit the genetic condition. Affected calves are often born with very short kinky hair that may fall out leaving bare spots or areas susceptible to rubbing. The condition may vary in expression as the animal matures and is usually less noticeable in older animals.

Crossbred cows e.g. Santa/Hereford X, Angus/Hereford or cows of another breed will not be affected by HY in any instance.

Please ensure you have some cattle in the yard, e.g. dry cows, steers for when your new bull arrives. These bulls have been run in large groups all their lives and being dropped in a yard all by yourself in a strange environment can be quite a daunting experience for a young bull that has never been by himself. Having cattle in the yard will alleviate extra stress for you and your bulls.
