Taking delivery of your new Bull

To help your new bull or bulls to settle into their new home as well as possible, the following points should be followed.

- All Hicks Beef bulls are run in large mobs their entire lives, so they've always had plenty of mates around, and they have <u>never</u> been alone.
- It's a good idea to have some cattle in the yard when the bull arrives to ensure that he has company.
- At Hicks beef we handle our cattle quietly and confidently. We use motorbikes and utes, with the aid of obedient dogs. The bulls have <u>not</u> been handled with horses.
- Handle your new bull/s quietly and with respect and he'll settle into his new home well, and will be easy to handle whenever the need arises.
- All sale bulls to be delivered to their new home within 7 days please.
